## Read Me First

Instructions for Accessing and Viewing the Digital Practicum Files of Fractured Atmospheres

The entire digital version of *Fractured Atmospheres* is available permanently through the University of Manitoba's MSpace Electronic Theses and Dissertations Collection at <a href="http://mspace.lib.umanitoba.ca">http://mspace.lib.umanitoba.ca</a> *Fractured Atmospheres* can also be accessed through search engines such as Google. A third but temporary access point is at <a href="http://home.cc.umanitoba.ca/~umyakiwa">http://home.cc.umanitoba.ca/~umyakiwa</a>
Please note that this link will be maintained for an undetermined timeframe, whereas the website files will remain accessible from MSpace at all times.

Contained within the "digital\_book\_animations.zip" file is a package of files that make up the practicum website. The website is a digital version of the PDF document enhanced with videos and stop motion animations of the work. The files must be extracted or unzipped before they can be viewed.

## The following instructions guide you through accessing the website files through MSpace.

- 1. Click "View/Open" for the "digital\_book\_animations.zip" file in MSpace. Click "Save" and select a convenient location to save the file, then click "Save" again.
- 2. Once the file has been downloaded, click "Open" and follow the instructions below.

On a PC, locate the file from where you saved it and right-click the archive icon. Select "Extract All". Windows will prompt you through the process. This may take several minutes. [Many computers use WinRAR to extract the files to a folder of your choice.]

On a Mac, double-click the archive icon. The Finder will create a new folder with the same name and decompress all the files from the archive in that folder.

- 3. Once the zip file has been downloaded and unzipped, the files can be accessed. Enter the website files by opening the folder entitled "digital\_book\_animations" and open the HTML file entitled "index" in the web browser software application of your choice. On a Mac, you can drag and drop "index" into the browser icon.
- 4. The website is best viewed with Safari.
